Mayor's Report -

A Thank You note was received from Lee and Dick Anderson for the Brenda Frederick Memorial. The Dedication Ceremony of December 5 went well it was well reported in the Olean Times Herald thanks to Cindy Wagner. The Frederick family was honored and well pleased.

The November 28th (abbreviated and social distanced) Christmas in the Park Lighting Ceremony went well. Mayor Evans asked if trustees McClarney and DeBarbieri could keep an eye out in the park to be sure sidewalks are cleared as we have had high pedestrian traffic by the public and to notify DPW of our intent to keep the sidewalks in the Park as clear as the walks in the Village.
